

The Arkansas Economic Development Commission (AEDC) prepares an incentive package for projects which reach a certain positive economic impact. It could contain, but not be limited to the following: The Advantage Arkansas Program, the Tax Back program, the ArkPlus program, Customized Training Incentives, and the Create Rebate Program, and the Governor's Quick Action Closing Fund.


