## Commercial Development

The City of Jonesboro issued 148 new

Priviledge Licenses in the first quarter of 2019. Of that total, 16 licenses were issued

for physicians and 17 for sub-contractors.

Retailer Tuesday Morning is making its return to Jones-

boro. The discount store is going to be one of the anchors in the re-developed Highland Square Shopping Center at the corner of Highland and Caraway, occupying a portion of the former Kmart location.

According to Tuesday Morning's website, the new store is set to open June 14.

Play It Again Sports is moving to a new home. The pre-owned sporting goods retailer

is moving from their store on Highland Drive across from The Mall at Turtle Creek to Highland Square, taking over the remaining 15,600 SQFT of the former Kmart location. With the addition of Play It Again Sports,

Ross, and Tuesday Morning, the former K-Mart space has now been completely filled.

"The Social" is coming to Greensborough Village.
The Social will be one of the anchors in the
multi-use project. The project will be
a "gathering place for food fun and
entertainment". The 12,000 SQFT
space will have indoor and outdoor
areas as well as a bowling feature.

First National Bank held the official Grand Open-

ing of First National Financial Park on April 5th. The 5-story, 60,000 SQFT building opened in January. It features a community room with a 30' wide video board, terrace, and a walking trail surrounding a water feature.



MedicOne Ambulance has expanded into St. Louis.



The Jonesboro-based company bought Gateway Ambulance in February, employing 142 additional people and operating 47 more pieces of equipment. Medic-One now employs 328 people.

The Starbucks on Southwest Drive in Jonesboro has a new owner. The Alana M. MookTrust, of Eureka, California purchased the coffee shop for \$1.54M. The deal closed on January 31st.

Mid-South Sales has merged with four other lubricant distributors to form Cadence Petroleum Group, based in North Carolina. Murray Benton of Mid-South Sales told Talk Business and Politics the merger is "the ideal situation for all of us." The company plans to keep existing leadership in place.

Melanie Runsick Photography is moving her studio to downtown Jonesboro.
Formerly in Valley View, Runsick will now do her studio work at 218 Union. She opened her first studio in Swifton in 2001.

Nabholz Construction is expanding in Jonesboro. The company says their new Specialty Service Group will handle diverse service and facility maintenance needs. 40 people are already employed by Nabholz in Jonesboro. The company says they expect to make more hires based on demand.

Texas Roadhouse is under construction on Caraway Road. The new restaurant is located between Kroger and the new Tommy's Car Wash, which opened in March. Haag Brown says the restaurant will be open later this year.

First National Banking Company held a Grand Opening for its Jonesboro branch on April

18th. The full-service location at the corner of Browns Lane and Windover is the 12th branch for FNBC, which is headquartered in Batesville. The new branch officially opened last year.

A new food concept is coming to downtown Jonesboro. A "food hall" will be occupying 321 S. Main Street. Clay Young of Young Investments says four restaurants will be in that space. At this point, The Parsonage is the only eatery to officially announce the move.

It didn't take long to fill the space vacated by N'awlin's in Downtown Jonesboro. A new restaurant,

Roots, will be moving into 303

S. Main this summer. The owners say the restaurant will infuse Ecuadorian flavors into American classics like fried chicken and will source their meals from local farmers.





# Quality of Life

#### Parks & Rec: Paving the Way

Softball season is underway, and with it, comes another improvement at the Southside Softball Complex. The City is paving the parking lot. This follows recent improvements to the lights, both in the parking lot and the playing fields. There will also be a new concession stand at Southside for players and fans. Parks Director Danny Kapales said the project will cost \$547,000. It's expected to be finished by mid-May.



#### Trail Plan Seeks Grant

Jonesboro's bike-pedestrian plan is applying for a grant. The
City has applied for just under \$500,000 from the Arkansas Department
of Transportation's TAP or Transportation Alternative Program. If
awarded, the money will be used for part of the A-State Link segment
of the trail. That part of the trail runs from Red Wolf Boulevard to
University Heights Elementary School along Aggie Road. Parks and
Recreation Director Danny Kapales says the grant will most likely be
awarded in the Fall.

### Tee It Up!

Jonesboro's Parks and Recreation Department received a \$30,000 grant to help teach children the game of golf. The funds will be used for trainers and equipment for children to use in the NEA Junior Golf initiative at CWL Park. The grant builds on the Junior Golf program that the city started in 2013 at Craighead Forest Park. Golfers use just one club to shoot at short-range targets in a team format.





# Project Updates

#### New Hotel Planned

The old Park Place Inn at 1421 S. Caraway has been demolished to make room for a new TownePlace Suites hotel. Construction will begin soon on the \$12-\$13M project. The structure last served as low-income monthly apartment rentals. In its place, TownPlace Suites, owned by Marriott, will build an 88-room extended stay hotel.

One part of the structure was left standing. The restaurant building that faces Caraway Road was saved and will eventually be the home of a yet unamed national chain restaurant.

The developer says construction should begin sometime this summer.



The \$130M Phase III Expansion of at St. Bernards is progressing. According to St. Bernards, the building will be totally "in the dry" by the end of May.

Next: installing the elevators and the new promenade entrance.

The expansion will house 14 new surgical suites as well as a 40-bed critical care unit. Chris Barber, the CEO of St. Bernards Healthcare says his staff can't wait for the day the new expansion is open for business.

"All of us at St. Bernards are excited about what this means for patient care. This expansion will enable us to offer Christ-like healing to even more patients and we are looking forward to the official opening later this year."

#### **Ever Rising**

Jonesboro's newest industrial project is nearing completion. The exterior structure of the Risever steel fabrication plant in the Craighead Technology Park is complete. Finishing touches are now being applied to the 25,000 SQFT office area.




### New Home Sales

**Q1-2019**/ feb mar Biggest Q1 on record






## Existing Home Sales

1st Quarter 2018-2019






